

Scrumptious Scarf

The yarn used for this soft, lacy scarf is baby mohair and silk—a beautiful indulgence to keep your neck warm. Although this yarn is not as easy to work with as your usual worsted weight yarn, the soft, sensuous scarf that results is certainly worth the effort.

Instructions

Body

Hint: When working with mohair yarn, always work sts loosely. Keep straight pin or seam ripper handy to loosen tangles. Use caution not to cut through core of strand.

Loosely ch 53.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 2 chs, in next ch work (sc, ch 3, 3 dc)—shell made; * (sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3) twice; sk next 2 chs, in next ch work (sc, ch 3, 3 dc)—shell made; rep from * 4 times more; sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch—6 shells. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2: Sc in first sc, ch 3, shell in next ch-3 sp; * (sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3) twice; shell in next ch-3 sp; rep from * 4 times more; sc in next sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rep Row 2 until scarf measures about 70", ending by working a right side row. At end of last row, do not ch 1. Finish off.

Lower Edging

Hold scarf with right side facing you and beg ch at top; join in first unused lp of beg ch; ch 1, sc in same lp; ch 3, working in sps formed by beg chs and in unused lps, shell in unused lp at base of next shell; * (sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3) twice; shell in unused lp at base of next shell; rep from * 4 times more; sc in last unused lp.

Finish off and weave in all ends.

Size:

About 10" x 72"

Materials:

Lace-weight mohair yarn, 900 yds (100 gms) teal

Note: Our photographed scarf was made with Knit One Crochet Too, Douceur et Soie Baby Mohair and Silk, # 8512

Size F (3.75mm) crochet hook, or size required for gauge
Size 18 tapestry needle

Gauge:

5 dc = 1"
